

Applying for a place at Upton Court Grammar School

Frequently Asked Questions

Eligible score to apply

Candidates must achieve a standardised score of **111 or above** to be eligible to apply for a grammar school place. Information on 2019 entry is available with your results; a copy of this is also available on the website.

How do I apply for a place at Upton Court Grammar School

You must name the school on the Common Application Form that you complete with your home Local Authority. You should rank your most preferred school highest. All preferences are considered using the oversubscription criteria for each school.

Is there a catchment area

There is not a designated catchment area; candidates who achieve a score of **111 or above** may apply for a place, irrespective of their home address. Please see the document 'Admissions Arrangements 2020-21' on this website for information on how the school prioritises admissions for children that have achieved the eligibility score.

Consideration under Free School Meals (Pupil Premium)

In the event of oversubscription, if you wish to be considered under section 6 (ii) of the Admissions Arrangements 2020-21, Free Schools Meals (Pupil Premium), please complete the Supplementary Information Form – Free Schools Meals, available on this website.

Request for re-marks

All the entrance tests are double scanned and checked using different optical mark readers and different staff. The process is reliable and trustworthy and as a result re-marks would be unnecessary. The likelihood of any mistake being made in recording the correct test responses from the multiple choice answer sheet is negligible. In common with the other Slough Consortium Grammar Schools, Upton Court Grammar School has therefore confirmed that they will not undertake any test remarks until after the national offer date (Sunday 1st March 2020). The cost of a re-mark would be £50 per paper.

Appeals

An appeal cannot be lodged until after the national offer day on Sunday 1st March 2020. At that time the appeal form and guidance notes will be available on the Slough Consortium website. Any school you wish to appeal to must be named on your Common Application Form.
